Plaintiff's Counsel emailed the Complaint and Court's Order and the requested alternative writs of mandamus to James Murphy at his office in Nashville, Tennessee after the entry of the Court's Order on the applications for writs of alternative mandamus on April 13, 2006.

During the morning of April 13, 2006 Plaintiff's Counsel called Mr. Murphy to schedule a hearing. Mr. Murphy agreed to a hearing anytime on April 14, 2006 and the parties agreed he would participate by telephone conference.

Plaintiff's Counsel relayed the Court's conditions to Mr. Murphy. Mr. Murphy stated he would have to confer with his client.

Mr. Murphy responded and informed Plaintiff's Counsel that the Election Commission would not agree to shorten 30 days and the Election Commission would not agree to an expedited hearing. Mr. Murphy's email response is attached.
